Their programs focus on the physical, emotional and spiritual-wellbeing of the people who choose to participate. The rehabilitation program is a 180-day residential work-therapy program that helps people recover and opens doors for a full life afterwards. We are thrilled to see transformed lives as Jesus moves to set people free. Participants receive rehabilitation training and support in a loving, Christian environment with the goals of better understanding themselves as well as experiencing a changed life. This program is free for adult men who are 21-65.
